### MCLC Foundation Annual Meeting Minutes from February 6, 2022 on Zoom

Call to Order: 1:01 PM by Cunningham

**Opening Prayer:** Legred

**Remarks:** Cunningham gave a brief history of the Foundation and the Good we have done in our brief History.

**Pastor's Remarks:** Pastor Kyle Jackson remarked on the history of Generosity, Outreach Support, and to never forget, but always think about how many lives we have touched over the years. His Quote: Thank the Lord for The Foundation!

Meeting Minutes from February 7, 2021: Motion to approve: Eggers; Second: Whisnant; Approved

Service Recognition of Ross McGlasson: Cunningham honored him with heartfelt thanks for all of his work over the Years and Sympathy to Him and his Family on the recent Loss of his Wife, Martha McGlasson. He will step away from his Board service for a while. Cunningham recognized him for being a mand who always follows through on his ideas.

Financial Report: Distad explained how our financials work. He stated that we grow revenue by Donations, Gifts and Memorials, Columbarium Sales and Investment Gain. We have no Employee expenses and minimal administrative fees for payment to the Church for our Financial Reporting. Our Assets totaled \$855,000 as of 12/31/2021.

**Grants throughout the years:** Cunningham highlighted Grants over the last four years. Whisnant created a video highlighting a few Grant recipients and how the Funds were used. Joel Legred of Luther Park reported on the many ways that Foundation have supported Luther Park Bible Camp. Dick Shell reported that a new Grant Request Form is ready and will assist us in tracking Grant Funds use. We intend to seek recipients with more diversity in the areas of Human Rights, Social Justice and Community Outreach.

**Coffee House Event Slated for April 22, 2022:** Affinito reported that the Event is intended to celebrate our achievements, create awareness and to interest the Mount Calvary Family in more participation. It is intended to be a Goodwill Celebration after the last two years of Pandemic Slowdown. Coffee, Special Guests, Music and Desserts. Tickets will be \$50 and limited to 100 Guests in Heritage Hall from 7 to 10 PM.

**Columbarium Update:** Pastor Legred thanked Ross McGlasson for his leadership in establishing the Columbarium.

Tribute to Orv and Vonni Olson: Foundation Provided the Funds for the Woodpecker Stained Glass.

**Dave Olson Youth Grant Gift is his Name:** Over and above our normal Grant process, the Board Provided a Thank You to Dave and the \$12,500 gift will provide \$2500 each year for 5 years for Special Youth Initiatives.

### 3. FOUNDATION FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

In 2022 the Foundation received gifts and contributions, including memorials, from more than 100 different individuals. Gifts and contributions to the Foundation continue in perpetuity. Only the earnings on the fund principal are used to make grants.

### 4. FOUNDATION GRANTS AND AWARDS

In the last five years the Foundation has awarded 46 separate grants totaling approximately \$180,000. (Attachment B)








# Grants by category (8 years)
